Edwin ("Ed") Henry, 94 of Springfield, passed away on Wednesday, February 12, 2025. He was born on September 10, 1930, to the late John Roosevelt and Sussie (Dilley) Henry, in Ironton, Ohio. Ed was a star athlete in high school playing both basketball and football. He served in the United States Air Force and later worked on the flight line at Wright-Patterson AFB. He retired in 1988 as a supervisor in the Jet Engine Maintenance Division. He is preceded in death by both of his parents, his wife of 65 years and love of his life Patricia (Patty), his son David, brother Gayne, sisters Virginia and Eileen. enjoyed fishing at Lake Erie and Canada. Pat and Ed adored gambling and traveled to Las Vegas several times to enjoy the casinos and the buffets. On more than one occasion both could be seen in the casino with a bucket full of pennies and pitch-black hands. Ed also loved to attend auctions and resold tools at his many garage sales throughout the years on Green Vista Drive. Many folks looked forward to his sales and came every year either to chat or search through the many treasures that he had for sale. Ed and Pat worked on election day for several years helping neighbors attend to their civic duty and catching up. After retiring from Wright Patterson, Ed worked at the Enon Hardware store for many years assisting friends and neighbors with their hardware purchases. He was a fan of the Cincinnati Reds often listening to the game on his back porch in the late hours of the evening. He was also excited when football season rolled around and faithfully watched Monday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday rooting for his favorite teams.
