Retha Ann Tirpack, 80, of Enon passed away Sunday, December 25, 2022. She was born February 24, 1942, in Corning, Ohio to the late Wayman and Mary Quigley Towner. She worked at Ohio State University and was the second employee at Wright State University, as the Assistant Dean of Admissions. Retha is survived by her husband, Boris Tirpack, whom she married in 1964, a son and daughter-in-law; Robert and Kelly Tirpack of Anchorage, Alaska, a daughter and son-in-law; Tiffany and David Spear of Lafayette, Colorado, a twin brother and sister-in-law, Robert and Jennie Towner of New Lexington, Ohio, five grandchildren; Cameron, Cody, Maya, Max and Eli, and numerous family and friends.
