



## Shelba Muncy

November 2, 1937 - March 29, 2023

Shelba Jean Muncy was born to the late Robert & LaVina Williams, a coal miner and a homemaker, in Meally, KY on November 2, 1937. After experiencing a typical Appalachian childhood, Shelba eventually graduated Meade Memorial High School and soon migrated to the Fairborn, Ohio area, where she married her true love & champion, Farrell Lee Muncy.

Together, the newlyweds set about building a beautiful life, eventually purchasing what came to be their warm & welcoming home, in a then-brand-new housing development called Lindair Acres and establishing a thriving family grocery business, which served the Enon, Ohio community for decades.

The arrival of the couple's only child, Elizabeth - added to the couple's happiness, with the three forming a cozy family unit and ultimately creating a safe harbor - at Lindair - for those who might need a helping hand or simply a place to spend the night.

What really meant the most to Shelba & Lee was the wellbeing of their daughter and the rest of their cherished family. And those blessed enough to know them - knew they could be counted on - to share the best of themselves - to offer common sense advice and/or hand you a fifty-dollar-bill, because they innately knew a little extra cash could only help most any situation.

Shelba was a larger-than-life personality, a true "kaleidoscope of colors" - who had many and varied interests.

Shelba is survived by her beloved daughter & son-in-law, Elizabeth Muncy & John Nasta. And she is also survived by her best friend of sixty-plus-years, Patricia Toler, along with her many nephews and nieces & their respective spouses, plus other special relatives, like Travis Collins of Lexington, KY.

Preceding Shelba in death were her husband, her parents; her sisters, Anna Ruth Williams; Wanda McCarty; Tera Williams; Betty Thurman, along with her brother, Robert Williams Jr. and her nephew, Rob Williams.

Shelba died on March 29th - after a lengthy illness.
